

Leroy F Schildt III, better known as “Cork”, was born in Tyrone, Pa (a town near Penn State University). Cork was close with his family, he and brother Gary (11 months younger) shared many adventures in school, college and military times, often with younger sister Vicki enjoying her brothers' antics. The Schildt's were very family oriented, huge supporters of Penn State Football and the Pittsburgh Pirates teams. The family often gathered, rekindling and laughing at their shared memories. Cork graduated from Tyrone Area High School in 1966, going on to attend Thompson Institute in Harrisburg, and Penn State University. He joined the United States Army Reserve in Bellefonte serving 6 years.

News of a new float glass plant in Mt Holly Springs brought Cork and a friend to the Mt Holly Springs area when they applied at PPG Industries. Cork started as a laborer and along with course studies elevated himself to lead maintenance man for the coater department. He retired from the plant after almost 38 years of employment.

Cork married Linda and together their family grew, raising 4 daughters and adding dogs into the mix. Cork was a faithful servant and extended his love of his Lord and Savior to everyone around him. He served as the President of the Full Gospel Businessmen's Fellowship. Cork loved coaching girls' softball for the Mt Holly Springs Youth Sports Association, becoming Vice President of the ball organization. He enjoyed The Three Stooges, Hamilton Restaurant's “Hotchie Dogs”, gardening, fishing (freshwater and saltwater) and being a Mr. Fix-It.

Cork desired to be more involved in his community, choosing to be a member of the Mt Holly Springs Borough Council. He served as Mayor for 8 years, until his passing in September 2021.
