

**Mt. Holly Springs Borough Council Committee
Meeting Minutes- April 29, 2021**

Call to Order – Mrs. Boyles called the April committee meeting of the Borough Council to order at 6:30 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance– The following members of the Borough Council were present; James Collins II, Katie Daniels, Sherry Boyles, Cathy Neff, Lois Stoner, and Gay Bowman. Also present was Thomas Day, Police Chief/ Borough Manager. Cindy Goshorn and Mayor Schildt were absent.

Ms. Daniels made a motion to approve the meeting minutes from the April 12, 2021 meeting of council as presented. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Stoner and passed by unanimous vote.

Citizens to be Heard -

Comments: Ms. Yearick presented a written report to council and spoke on many of the points included. Ms. Yearick, council members, and Chief Day engaged in discussion regarding some of her report.

Ms. Daniels provided a summary of the codification review. Members discussed the next steps in the process.

Chief Day mentioned a discussion with another township regarding problems with trash service. Ms. Daniels inquired about information she had shared with him regarding WCCOG members who, as a group, are switching service providers and keeping rates low. This cooperative would mean Mt. Holly Springs Borough would not handle billing and Chief Day indicated this would lead to a loss administrative revenue for the Borough.

Chief Day reported on the progress at Trine Park and discussed \$60,000.00 funding for upcoming additions to the park that are above and beyond those proposed and paid for by the grant funding that was secured. He recommended the general fund could be reimbursed when the monies expected from the COVID-19 federal relief package are received. Ms. Daniels requested the relief funds distribution proposal previously discussed.

Ms. Daniels inquired about the PennDOT traffic study on Yates Street and the status of a condemned property. Chief Day had no additional information at this time.

Adjourn – Mr. Collins made a motion to adjourn that was seconded by Mrs. Neff. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting adjourned at 7:47 p.m.
